from the practice of law. (3/10/86, N.T. 57)

- 5. Morrison was active in many community activities including serving as a director of the Germantown Boys Club, a member of the NAACP, and a member of his church. Further, Morrison was active politically and had been a Republican Candidate for Philadelphia City Council. (3/10/86, N.T. 58)
- 6. Morrison testified during his years of practice that he had a serious drinking problem. (3/10/86, N.T. 59)
- 7. He testified that he began drinking in 1972 when his three year old died as a result of drowning. (3/10/86, N.T. 59); that his drinking essentially became totally out of control after his divorce in 1976, (3/10/86, N.T. 59); and that during 1982, 1983 and 1984 he was intoxicated almost every day. (3/10/86, N.T. 59)
- 8. Since his suspension from the practice of law in November of 1984, Morrison has sought to control his alcoholism. (3/10/86, N.T. 60)
- 9. He sought the help of attorney John Rogers Carroll who is the Chairman of the Pennsylvania Bar Association committee established to assist lawyers with drug or alcohol related problems. (3/10/86, N.T. 60)
- 10. He also voluntarily sought inpatient care for his alcoholism at the St. Johns Hospital in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and was admitted there as an inpatient for 38 days from March, 1985 to April, 1985. He successfully completed the program. (3/10/86. N.T. 60)
